# 1911 William Churchill

## b BroadOak

- Here we see my grandfather Prothero Churchill aged 17 in 1911 living in Welsh the mining town of Tredegar with his parents William and Elizabeth Ann and some siblings and a "cousin" or rather someone described as niece of his father

- Note that William gives his place of birth a BroadOak but doesn't say in which county although the census clerk has helpfully added "England"

- Be careful about the ambiguity of relationships stated in the census. It took me quite a bit of digging to establish exactly how Florrie is related to this family and it's more complicated than "niece". In fact it turns out she is that Elizabeth Ann (Green) Churchill is her 1st Cousin Once Removed and Elizabeth's son Prothero Churchill is Florence's 2d Cousin. Florence and Prothero are the Great grandchildren of James Green born around 1794 of Zeals Wiltshire and who married in Gillingham Dorset.

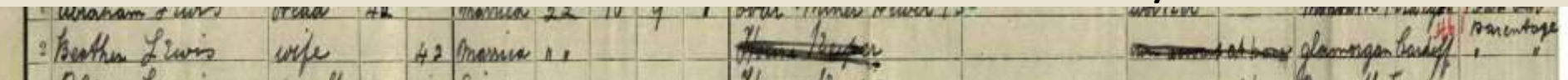

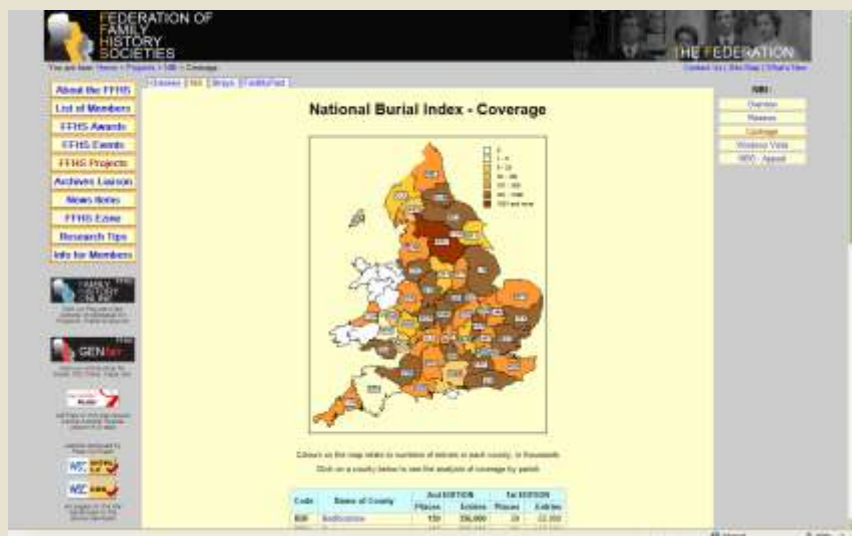

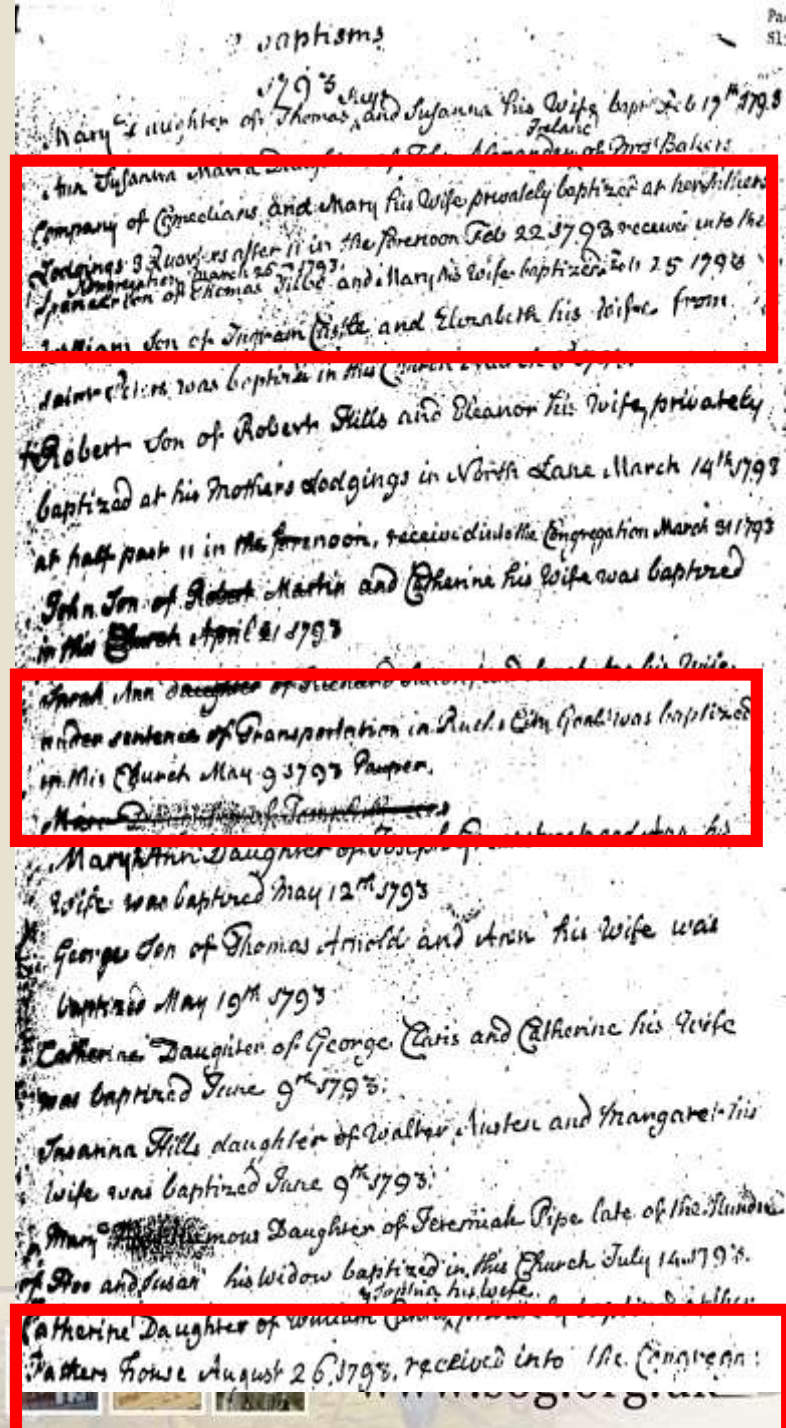

- Separate banns books
- Only Jews and Quakers exempt

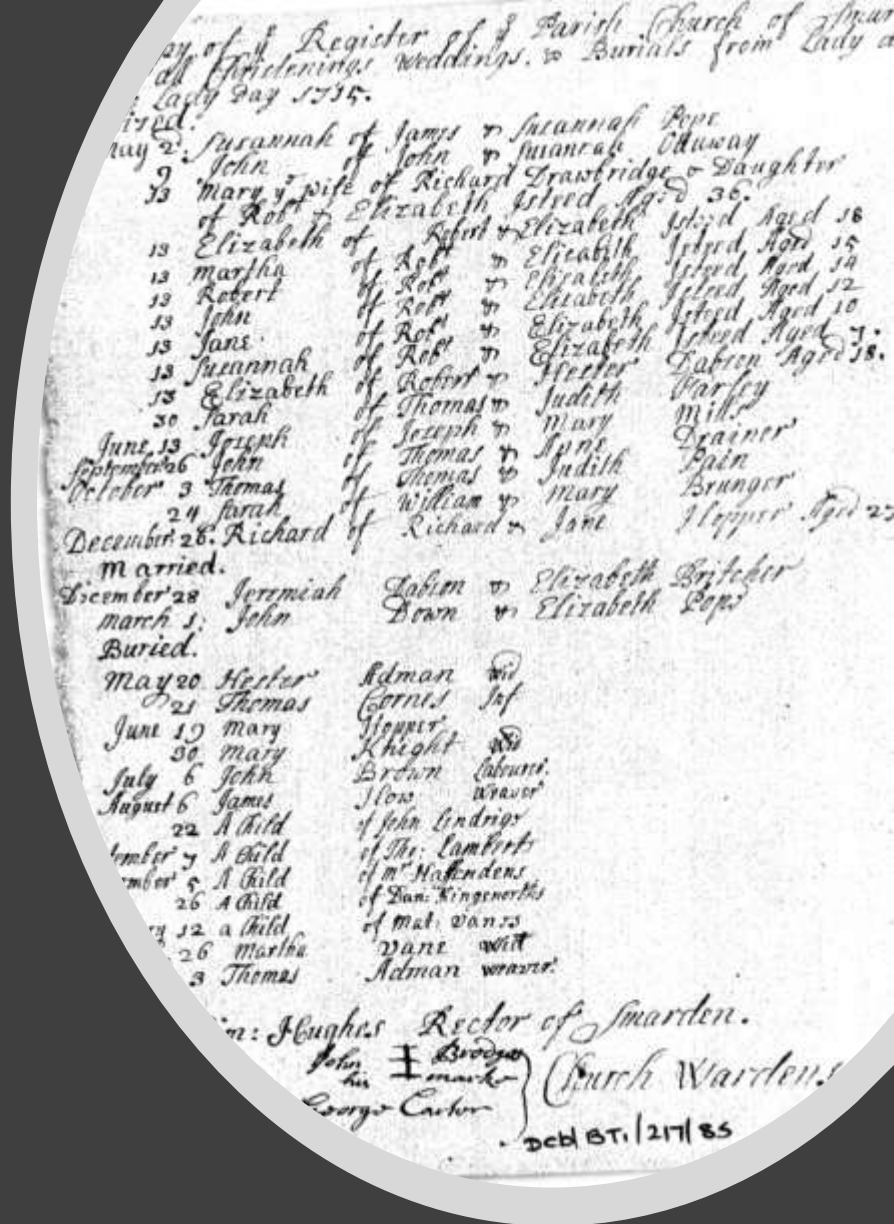

# Adult Baptisms

Smarden in Kent BTs for the year 1714 These official copies of the registers were compiled each year and sent to the diocesan registry. The copy shows the entries for the year starting at Lady-day (25<sup>th</sup> March). Here we can see some adult baptisms where the age is given and the children of Robert and Elizabeth Isteed all baptised on the same day yet aged between 18 and 7. Possibly the family had hitherto been nonconformist but when the eldest daughter Elizabeth came to marry the vicar insisted she be christened in the Church of England.

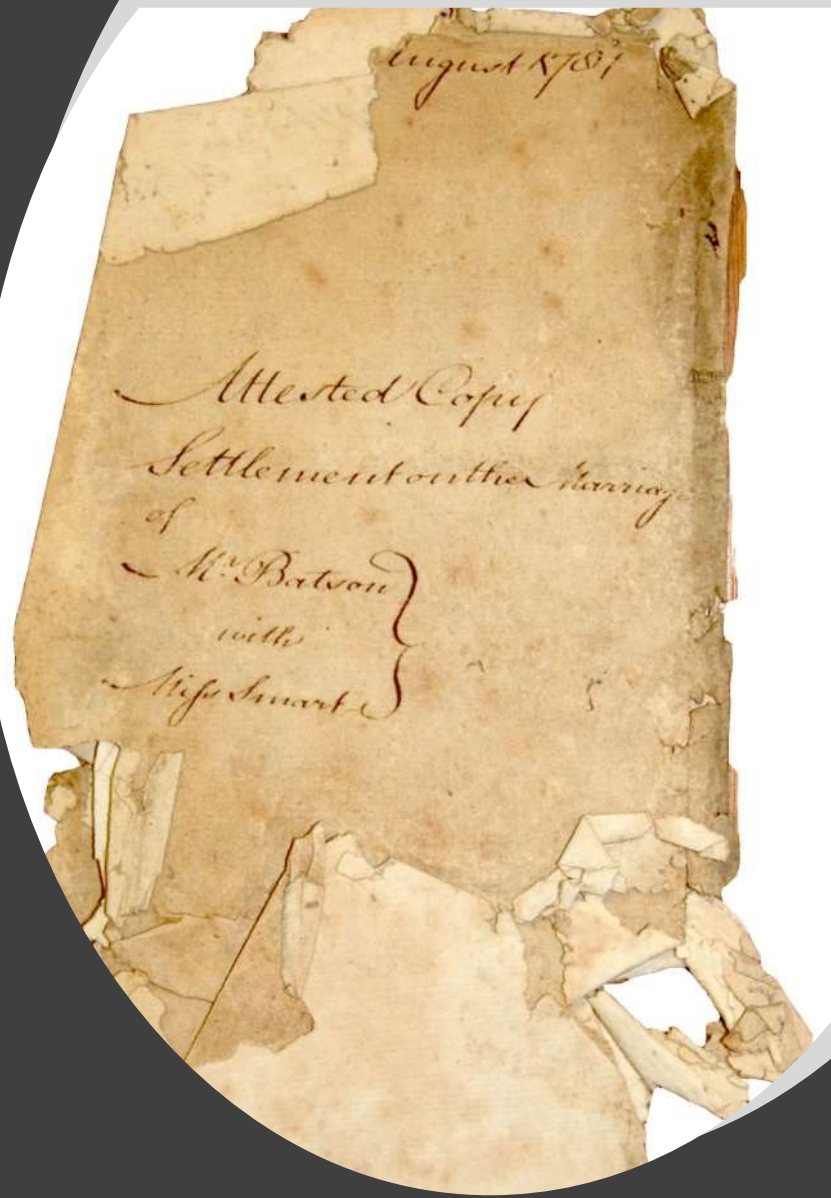

# Marriage Settlement of Mr Batson with Miss Smart August 1781

- There is no place where marriage settlements or other such original and personal family documents might be deposited. This settlement found in family papers a SoG outlines a form of pre nuptial agreement between the families. Occasionally they may be lodged in the registries of Deeds
- FamilySearch and Ancestry show the marriage by licence of Robert Batson (widower of "St Annes Middlesex") and Mary Smart at St Dunstons and All Saints, Stepney on 16 August 1781. There is a Faculty Office Marriage Licence for this marriage issued by the Archbishop of Canterbury on 14th August and indexed by the Society on SoG Data Online & the Findmypast website.
- Altogether these documents shed light on the practice of marriage in the 18th century.

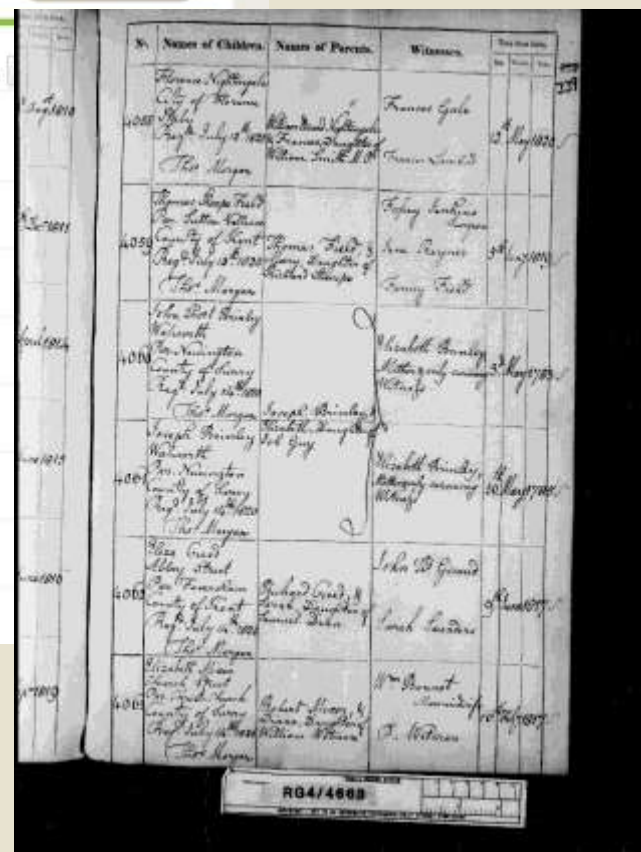

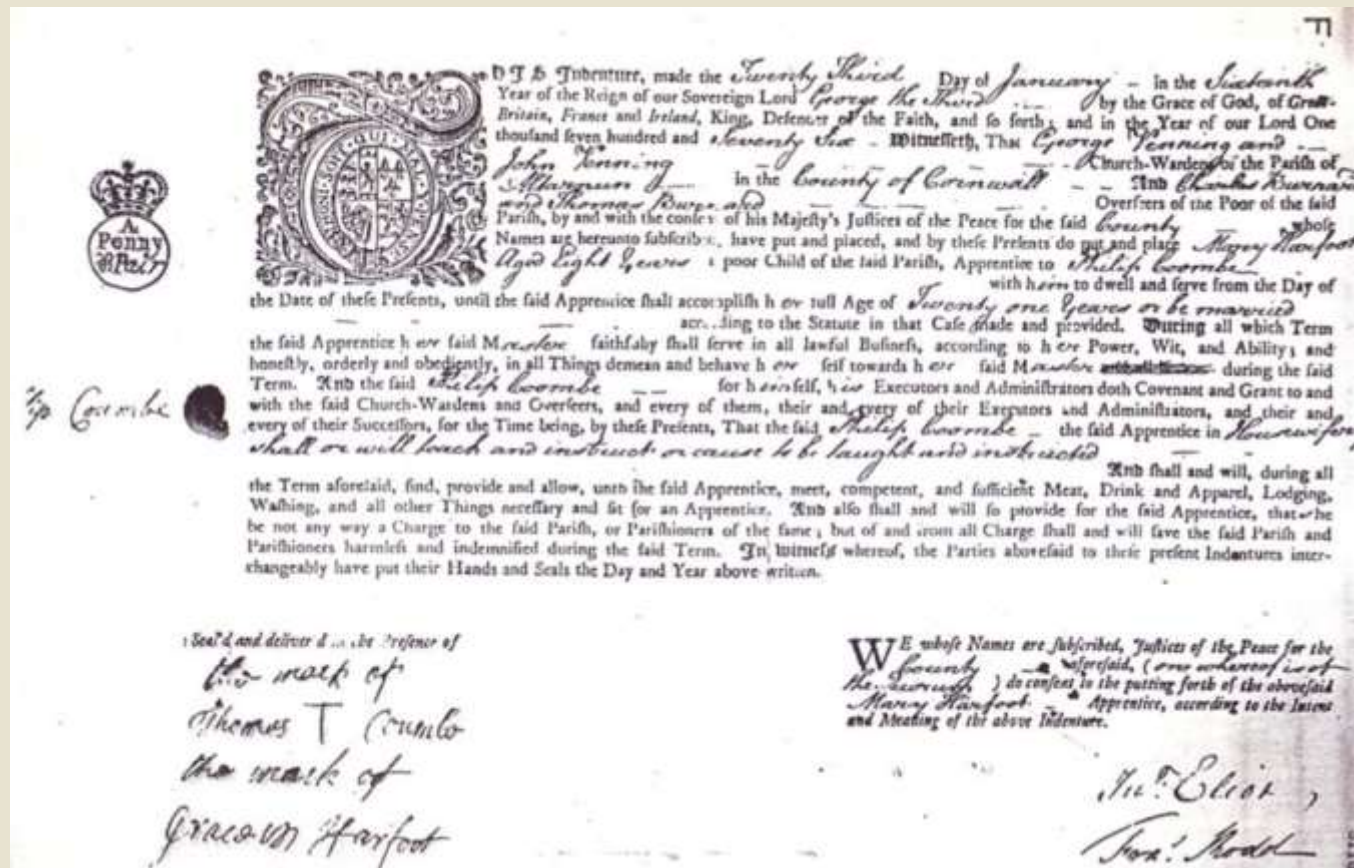

The village lies four and half miles north of Colchester and about four and half miles from Westminster, Essex.

### About the Site

Ardleigh's Past started out purely as a site of genealogical data for family historians whose ancestors were Ardleigh's residents. Due to the unexpected interest in other aspects of information about the village I have been adding more topics. Information currently covers 1596 onwards but in the main parish records cover 1550 up to 1900 to ensure the privacy of those who may be living. I am not a professional researcher and I do not manually gain in any way. I collect the information for local historical interest and genealogical interest. Accuracy is of importance but please use the information as a guide for your research and where possible examine the primary source.

### Working Process

I am in the process of creating a comprehensive database on as many of Ardleigh residents previous to 1930. It is far from complete but I have put the research dates covered on the first page of the database and any additions will be noted as the database is updated gradually. I have thousands of parish entries to add and thousands to transcribe so it will take some time to complete. **Returns of Roman Catholics**

Between 1680 and 1781, Parliament requested information about known or reputed Roman Catholics on a number of occasions. This information was laid before the House of Lords and survives in the Parliamentary Archives.

In most cases individual cases of people were not recorded but in some instances, especially in 1767, they were. If your ancestor was a Roman Catholic and you know where they lived in 1767, you might want to consult the Roman Catholic returns (historically known as 'Papists' Returns).

**Tracing returns of Roman Catholics at the Parliamentary Archives**

You can search our online catalogue Portfolio for returns of Roman Catholics. Enter 'papist returns' in the Any Text field, and the year or year range in the Date field, to bring up a list. Returns survive for 1680, 1706, 1767 and 1781, although individual names may not always be given - in many cases there are only total numbers of Catholics given, or descriptions of individual people including details such as age and occupation but omitting the name. Make a note of the references for the diocese you are interested in, and contact us to make an appointment to see the files or order copies.

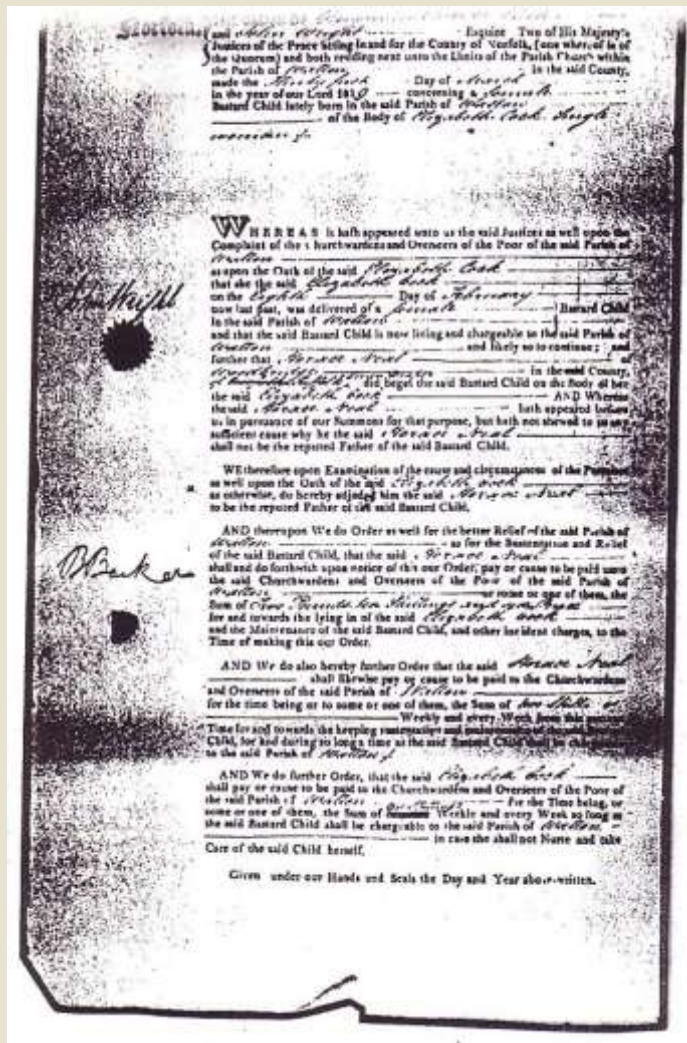

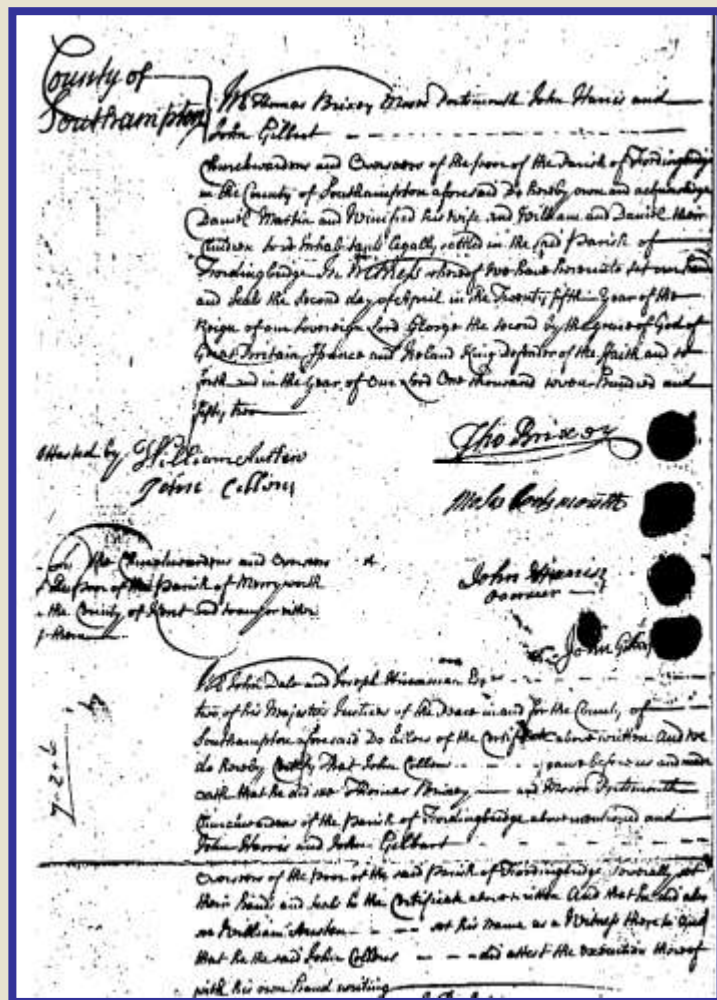


# **The Settlement examination of William Bridge, a militia man in the Sussex Regiment of Militia taken upon oath the 4<sup>th</sup> February 1779.**

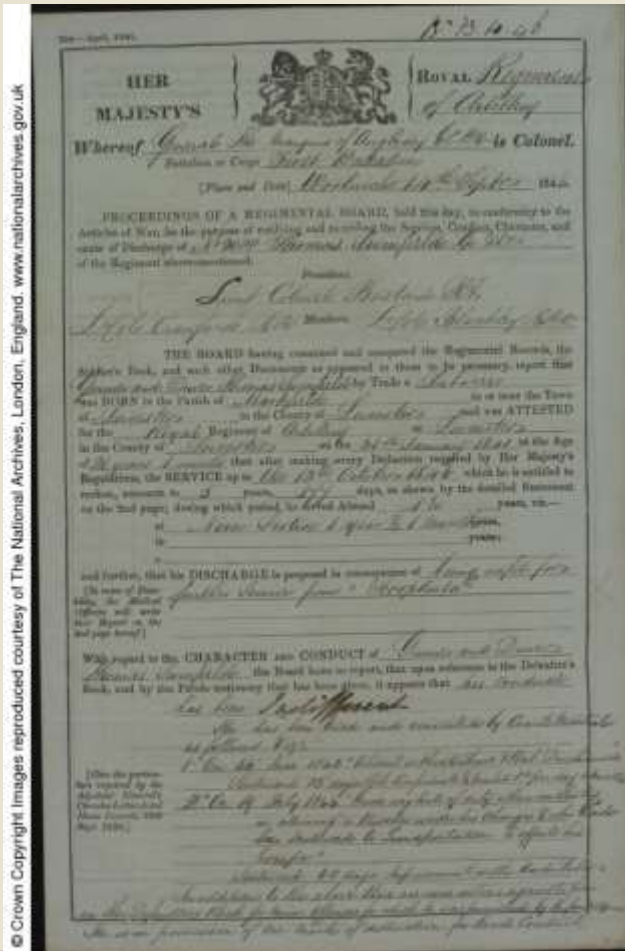

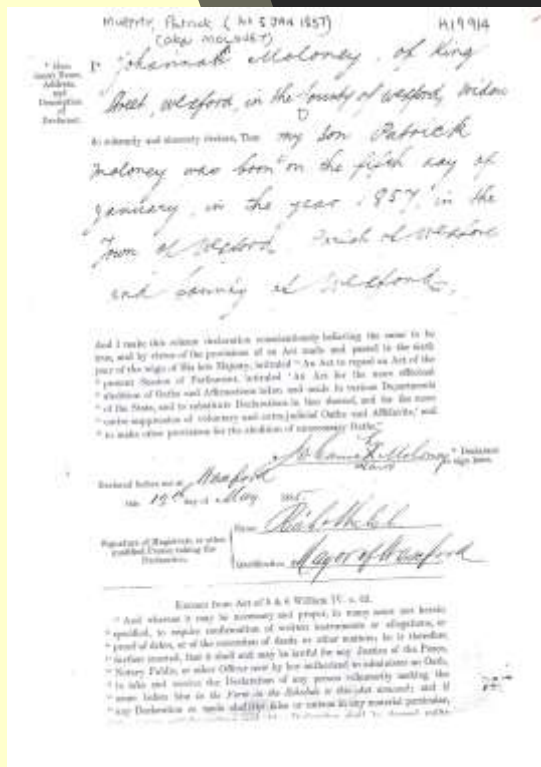

# Civil Service Evidences of Age Patrick Malony b 5 Jan 1857



- Certified declaration by Mother Joahnna Malony that son Patrick was born 5 Jan 1857
- "Certified" extract of Baptism PM s/o Patrick Malony & (Mary) Johanna Murphey b 5 Jan 1857
- Report from postmaster ... PM is illegitimate son of Mary Murphey, baptised Patrick Murphey. Candidate is unaware of his real name having been misled by his mother on circumstances of his birth
- Certified extract from Workhouse Catholic Chapel Patrick illegitimate - parents Patrick Tully and Mary Murphey baptised 5 Jan 1857
- Certified copy of Official Workhouse Register Patrick Murphey born 5 Jan 1857 baptised 6 Jan 1857 parents Mary Murphey and reputed father Patrick Tulley
- Letter reporting that the priest having been confronted said the mother had appealed to him and gave an account of the circumstances and that the name Mary she had given at the time was untrue and her real name was Johanna and that the name Malony by which PM is known is her mother's which she called him after leaving the workhouse ... to prevent an exposure she begged the clergyman to insert the names of the parents as Patrick Maloney and Johanna Murphey ... not imagining it made any difficulties as long as the dates were correct.

This is to certify that the accompanying Sanskrit horoscope marked A with my signature and today's date purports to be the horoscope of the second son of Babaji Tekhn Bhat surname Cha'kor by his wife named Lakshmi, and that the date of the birth as stated therein, namely Monday the 4<sup>th</sup> (fourth) day of the bright half of the month of Falgun in the year 1905 of the Samvat era of Vikraman (or Vikramantya) and in the year 1770 of the Lakshminia Shaka Era, corresponding, according to the 'Chronological Tables', published under the authority of the Government of Bombay in 1850, with the 26<sup>th</sup> day of February in the Christian year 1849 one thousand, eight hundred and forty-nine.
